

FINDING MY HEAD...

In last month's newsletter I reported the Bronwyn and my MGA (although I suspect, like a poorly behaved child, under these circumstances it is MY MGA sung to the tune of YMCA – apologies to the village people and Norman Ewing...) had unfortunately blown a cylinder head gasket before we had the opportunity to show the car at the club for the January pub evening. I feel that I must follow-up that report with my findings regarding the source of the failure...

Our 'A is fitted with a 1622cc B-series engines, the last of the MGA type engines, with a bore of 76.20 mm. However, the engine has been fitted with a MGB cylinder head. The 1798cc MGB engine has a bore of 80.26 mm – and the combustion chamber in the cylinder head is sized accordingly.

The installation of an MGB cylinder head on an earlier B-series engine is not a bad thing, but it is important that the later cylinder head gasket is used. This had not been done on our MGA, and a standard MGA head gasket had been used. This meant that the gasket was sitting inboard of the combustion chamber – the poor thing didn't stand a chance!

The installation of an MGB cylinder head gasket should permanently solve the problem – now all that remains is to put it all back together!

Evening of 2 February 2015

On the evening of 2 February 2015, between the last member leaving the club after the Noggin and the gardener arriving in the morning the club was broken into.
