The Magnum Rally 2017



The 2017 Magnum Rally was scheduled from the 9th to the 13th of August. Registration and scrutineering to happen on Wednesday the 9th (Woman's day) rallying on Thursday Friday and Saturday, and the trip home on the Sunday.



Having been caught out before at the toll gate on the N4 outside Witbank on a Public Holiday, we decided to be clever and travel up on Tuesday the 8th, thus missing the holiday traffic. It would also give us an extra night away in Mpumalanga which is always welcome. Oh well, who were we to



know that the latest motion of no confidence in our illustrious President would be held that day. In their usual law abiding manner, the Taxi industry decided to blockade Witbank and the N4. It took us close to an hour to make it through Witbank with the B's water temperature gauge reading 90psi at times. Fortunately the B did not boil and actually used no water at all. On our way again we stopped for a splash and dash at Milly's before continuing to White River to pick up our Sabi Valley Coffee at the Casterbridge Centre. A quick look round showed that the vehicle museum was really not worth a visit so we carried on to Hazyview and booked into the Numbi Hotel for the duration of the event. That night we had supper in the Pioneer Grill. Now moved to the Perry Bridge Centre the standard of the steaks was still amongst the best I have tasted.



A few of the other entrants and some of the organisers had also arrived so some good socialising was on. Wednesday saw most of the rest of the competitors arriving, and the car park was filled with a variety of machinery including many bikes, one with sidecar, and cars ranging from an old XK Jag, Volvos, MGs, a Rolls belonging to new Club Members Christo and Lorna, a Mustang and many others. The scrutineers were kept busy most of the afternoon. For some strange reason, the drivers side seat belt inertia reel on the B seized up, fortunately a trip to Midas located a generic belt which was fitted and usea-

ble until the correct part can be found.

Thursday morning had scheduled the first car away at 9.01, we being number 36 had ample time for breakfast in the Numbi which was of its usual good standard before hitting the road.

The day's route took us out of Hazyview and up the R536 to Sabie where there was a fuel stop, mainly for the bikers. Leaving Sabie we travelled via Graskop to Pilgrims Rest and Ohrigstad, ending at the Blyde River Canyon Resort for lunch and then back to Hazyview by a fairly circuitous route. Total distance for the day was 262 km in a total time of six and a half hours.

The beauty of rallying with data loggers instead of marshalls meant we had our results within half an hour of finishing. We were second in class for the day, with a rather disappointing 532 seconds.

Supper and drinks at the hotel, followed by a reasonably early night, saw us ready for day 2.

Day 2 saw us again to Graskop and then to God's Window, towards Mbombela via Sabie and to a private collection of cars and planes for the lunch stop. A run via Robbers Pass and Sabie saw us back in Hazyview. 280km and 7 hours.

Unfortunately, the increasing use of Long Tom Pass by ore trucks rendered it unsafe for rallying, so the routes were a little similar. Not that the driver or navigator really have time to register where they have been for the day. This day saw us finish 3rd in class with a score of 595, well off the pace.

Day 3 was a short day of 183km in 3 and 1/2 hours. We went via the back road to Kiepersol, more suited to 4x4s, then down to White River, then back to Sabie past the Jock of the Bushveld monument. Day 3 saw us a long way down the days leaderboard with 584 penalties, not a good run.

An early finish for lunch at the Pioneer Grill was followed by a rest prior to the prize giving dinner back at the Numbi.



Surprisingly, despite our bad day 3, we managed a second overall in class, more due to other's mistakes than a good performance from us. We came second behind a young couple in Stephen Grover's old 323 BMW.

New NC members Christo & Lorna Ferreira came 3rd in the class in a Rolls Royce, but have promised to compete in their BGT next year.

In the open odo "touring class" Jhb members Pierre & Amanda van Hell came 13th in their MGB, (they deserve a medal for endurance in keeping their car going) Rod & Sharon Herman were 9th in a Mustang, and Brian Atkins 15th running solo in an MGB.

The BGT is enjoying an extended rest in the garage before I set to getting a new seatbelt, mending the exhaust, and discovering where the brake fluid is disappearing to. Close to end of day 2 on Robbers Pass the pedal travel got longer and longer until I refilled the empty master cylinder reservoir in Sabie, and at every fuel stop since.

All in all a hard few days on the car, the driver, and especially the hard working navigator who came home with a very bad cold & cough.

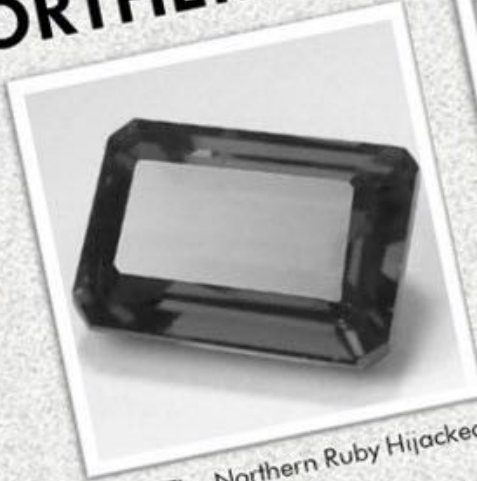
Will we go next year? This remains to be seen when we have recovered from this one.

BREAKING NEWS NORTHERN RUBY HIJACKED!



The Northern Ruby Hijacked



Suspected Jewel Thief Miz Jozi

Jacaranda City - Notorious jewel thief implicated in the disappearance of the Northern Ruby last night, police said.

Museum staff noticed the theft when deactivating the Museum's alarms in the early hours of the morning. No alarm was tripped during the night.

"It's Shocking!" said one museum worker, who wished to remain anonymous, "the highly sophisticated security system was active for the duration of the heist. Dodging the laser sensor alone would have required remarkable knowledge - not to mention

Miz Jozi, who's real name is unknown, rose to cult status after the Winged Diamond was stolen from the travelling exhibition held at the Plaza Hotel.

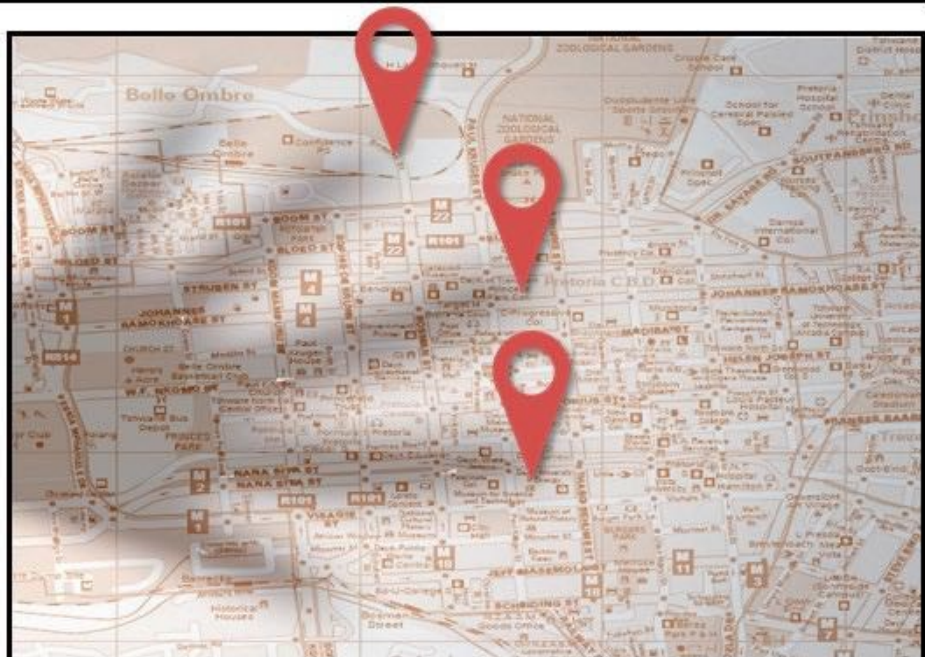

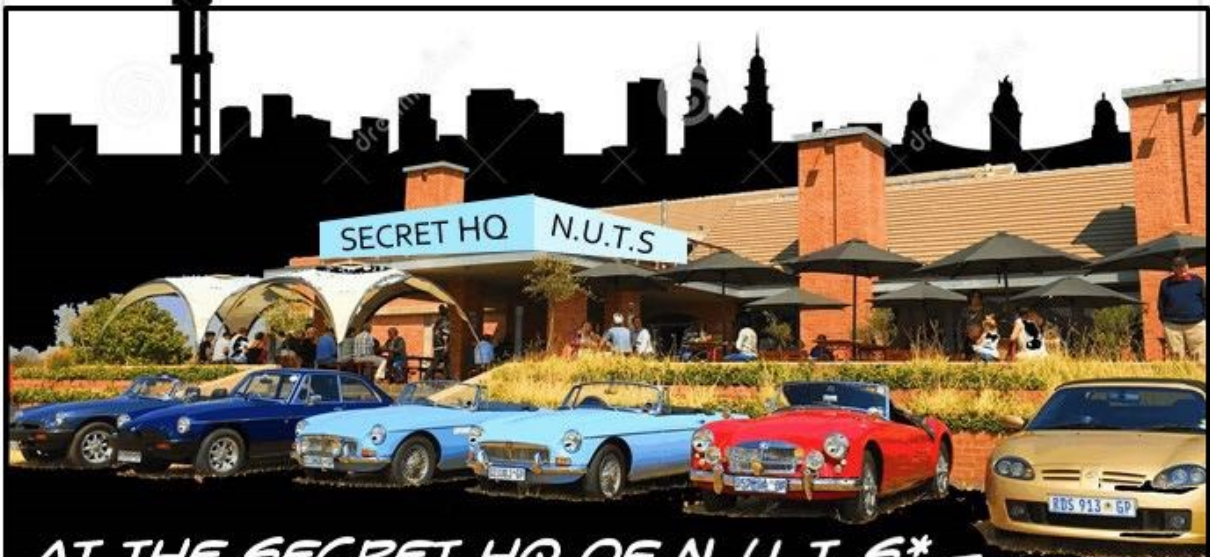

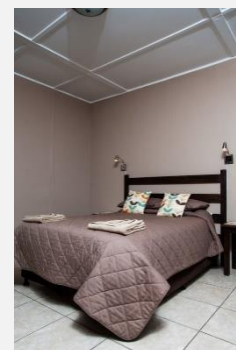
There are three types of accommodation available to us at Drakensville. These are:

1. A limited number of one bedroomed units.
2. Two-bedroomed houses to be shared. One bathroom and separate toilet.
 - a. Three-bedroomed houses to be shared by 2 couples. Bathroom, separate shower and Separate toilet.

For those who prefer not to share, it is possible to utilize a two-bedroomed house for one couple only. For those who would prefer their own bathroom facilities but don't mind sharing the rest of the house, it is possible to utilize a three-bedroomed house for two couples. These two options will cost a bit more per head.

Details of total cost depending on which accommodation options is selected:-

1. One-bedroomed unit some with double bed and others with single beds, shower & toilet.
Single occupant: **Cost R5240.00**
NB. Limited number only – first come first served.
2. One-bedroomed unit some with double bed and others with single beds, shower & toilet.
One couple: **Cost R7700.00.**
NB. Limited number only – first come first served.
3. Two-bedroomed house, 1 x double bed & 2 x single beds, separate Shower & Toilet.
One couple or two singles: **Cost R8000.00**
4. Two-bedroomed house, 1 x double bed & 2 x single beds, separate Shower & Toilet.
Two couples sharing: **Cost R13000.00. (R6500.00 per Couple)**
5. Three-bedroomed house, 1 x double bed, 4 x single beds, separate Bathroom, Shower & Toilet.
Two couples sharing: **Cost R14500.00 (R7250.00 per Couple)**

The above total cost includes dinner and breakfast. Lunch and bar charges are excluded.
