We have been to stay at Rissington Inn many times in the past but recently it has become a little



expensive. Their offer, to "faithful friends and frequent visitors" on some new rooms proved too good an opportunity to miss. So off we went! As in the past the Rissington Inn provided a most enjoyable stay.

Going to the area we decided we could also use the trip to check up on things for the MGCC NC 40th anniversary weekend.

We went to see Willem Fick, owner of the Numbi Hotel where we had arranged to stay. Somewhat disconcertingly he said that we would not be staying at the Numbi, but at his new Boutique Hotel. But, there was no need to worry.

All in all we had an enjoyable, if too busy, few days and are sure that things are on track for the weekend away in August.


Some road advice The roads of Mpumulanga are still in need of some repair

- The route via the N4, over Schoemanskloof to Nelspruit and White River is fine and free of potholes.
- The road from Belfast to Lydenburg via Dulstroom is very poor with some vast potholes.
- Long Tom Pass is busy with many large slow moving log and coal trucks. There are also potholes.
- The section from Sabie to Hazyview is in poor condition.

There are bad potholes and must be driven at 60km/hr maximum. It may be advisable to avoid this route, despite the scenic interest.


