


August celebrates National Woman's Day on the 9th!

Combined Centres Show Day

Johannesburg Centre hosts the Combined Show Day at the end of the month a highlight of the MG calendar



The MG Car Club Johannesburg Centre is hosting the annual Combined Centre Show Day at the Museum of Military History, adjacent to the Johannesburg Zoo, on Sunday the 30 September. The day is a wonderful opportunity to engage with MG family from the Johannesburg Centre as well as our Northern brethren. The true MG Marque of Friendship.

Gates will be opening at 7:30am with the official start time at 8:00am.

Of course the highlight of the day is the magnificent MG car display. Members who are exhibiting their pride and joy in the Concourse d'état and the Tops Only, will need to be in position by 9:00am. The judging will commence at 9:30am and is expected to be held within the Museum precinct.

Concours d'état cars are scored on originality, condition and cleanliness. The Tops Only entrants are marked only on condition and cleanliness. While the judging and scoring introduces a competitive element to the day, the real spirit of show day is that of fun and encouragement to MG enthusiast to "maintain the breed".

The R50 per car entrance fee is payable for all cars entering; including those that are not entered into any event. Entry will include a commemorative dash plaque and a programme and will require an indemnity be completed. The fee, payable at the gate, grants access to the Military Museum (normally R40 per person). There will be ample time to explore the national collection of guns, aircraft + army vehicles, plus medals + exhibits on medicine and history.

Bring your folding chairs and blankets and pack your picnic basket with lunch and refreshments. No fires are allowed within the venue so the Northern members will have to manage an outing without a Braai!

The venue will not only offer a wonderful lawn for our picnic but also provides a unique opportunity to photograph our cars alongside historic airplanes and artillery. The day is expected to be wrapped up by 4:00pm.

A more detailed program of events will be posted closer to the event but in the meantime, book the date and start polishing your wheels!






