

Clubman + Lodorum

Stephen Grover clarifies the allocation of merits for points based trophies

The Car Club runs two points based competitions over the course of the calendar year: Clubman and Lodorum

Clubman Trophy

Points are allocated for attending events, attending events in an MG of any kind, or organising events.

At the end of the year the "Clubman" is announced, and gets bragging rights, a trophy and their name on the wall.

Points are allocated as follows:

Attending an event: 10 points
 Attending an event in an MG: 10 points

3. Organising an event: 30 points(non-Exco member)

20 Points (Exco member)

4. Proposing a new member: 40 points5. Sponsoring a new member: 30 points

Note that in order to earn points in category 4 or category 5 the member either proposing or sponsoring the new member MUST accompany the new member to 3 out of the next 6 club events.

Lodorum Trophy

Victor and Victrix Lodorum is awarded to the member who performs best in the competitive events hosted by, or sanctioned by, the Club. These include timed events, concours event, and treasure hunt type events.

Points are awarded for where the entrant places overall, as well as in their class if applicable.

Unlike the Clubman Trophy, points are awarded differently depending on what MG is used in the event.

The older the MG the better


- maximum points being awarded for a pre-war car (16 points) and
- minimum for a modern (8 points)

The next Lodorum event is the condition concours at the Clubhouse Sunday 26 May.

We hope that by publishing the results on a monthly basis we will encourage members to be more active, and climb the leader board.

Will on Racing

William Kelly reports on their March outing at Midvaal

MIDVAAL was our first official points effort for Pursuit racing for the New Year as the Passion for Speed event in February didn't count towards this. And despite our (Stuart's) best efforts Jimmy was not ready to fulfil his race entry. Engine is in, clutch master cylinder needed replacement and time to test and make ship shape simply wasn't on hand. So we withdrew his entry and proceeded with the entry of Cookie, the BGT between the two of us as drivers.

However Jimmy will be ready barring hellfire and brimstone for the next race, end April 2019. The road has been long but it has been worth it. And we have learned a lot along the way too!

We entered Pursuit and Sports > with the car. Practise on Friday was a late start and Rikus got a number of laps in before the rain arrived. As a result of the weather I didn't go

out but Rikus reported all was well in the car.

The next day saw us just sneak into the drivers briefing on time ahead of qualifying. Qualifying saw me up for first for Purssuit and Rikus did Sport & GT. Best time I set

was a 1:26.8 and Rikus set a 1:34 for Sports & GT, have never driven this track before.

First race was Pursuit. Second gear had been giving us some irritation and so I thought I could time the start to hit the line smack on my departure time to jump from 1st to 3rd and save myself the trouble of making up time later. As it turns out I was 2 seconds early.

Anyway at the time I didn't know it and it was a really great race – lot of tight racing and a very satisfying 0.015 pip to the post of Richard Tudor-Owen in his Merc 190. As it happened it was his 70th birthday! So I

felt a little bad, but all was rectified when my 2 second penalty kicked back in and I was moved down three places, from 4th to 7th from a field of 22 entries.

Rikus then went out in Sports & GT and had a bit of a lonely race – but still finishing 2nd in class. His lap times dropped steadily from what I could make out from the wall and of course the car ran flawlessly.

The intention had been to share the two drives and split the races. But with the lap time differences and because of the way Pursuit works, Rikus would have been hopelessly compromised on the start of the second heat. He very generously then gave the drive to me and this time I didn't jump the start. Again, it was a close race with the Porsche of Willem Brits and I changing places – it was satisfying to take it back from him having been passed by him, but then coming back onto the pit straight I ran wide, got onto the grass and almost spun.

As it happened I managed to keep things more or less in shape but the entry back to the track was naturally violent and knowing how close he was behind me I was expecting the worst. Somehow though he managed to avoid me but passed me and that was the end to the catch up lead I have been building up for the previous 6 laps. I went around trying to make up for lost time but those crucial one or two seconds were too much and on the last corner I couldn't get past Citroen of Rob or the MX5 of newcomer Gerdus Brits across the line. One small slip cost me two places and the final results will show I finished 8th overall for heat 2.

For the day it was 6th overall for us (4th in Trophy Cars), our best result yet. Richard Tudor-Own won the heat in Fine Car Class, just for good measure having come 3rd overall.



Rikus then proceeded to win his class in the second Sports & GT race and we still have no idea what this means. Presumably a trophy is out there with his name on it! I clocked a respectable 1:31 from him and having barely managed a 1:27.5 myself in racing the gap continues to close.

We were the only MG on track other than the YP MGA which finished both of the Pursuit races that it was entered in. Michael Mateus drove really well in it and did them proud. Good to see the car going strongly and finishing 15th overall!




Sadly production was limited as sustainability and return on investment in the production of the cars was far out weighed by the imposed government duties.

Thanks to Alan Grant for driving his very special Protea Triumph from Johannesburg to Pretoria. The same car that won the 1958 endurance 6 hour race at Roy Hesketh circuit in Natal at the hands of John Myers.

Also in attendance was Tim Cooke the first customer to purchase a Protea as well as Marge Viljoen who was part of the racing scene in the very early days, both in their late 80's and still as enthusiastic as ever!

A very special night of history and memories shared on a cool Autumn evening.

The idea of a Technical Day has been up for discussion a number of times, but we have never seemed to be able to put a suitable date and venue together nor decide the form the day would follow.





awesome Midget back on the road with a refreshed gearbox.









Durban Dash

An exciting trip to the Scottburgh Classic Car Show has been arranged by Classic Car Event!

Entry Forms are at the end of the Newsletter



Some years ago a character by the name of Hugh Anderson put on an event called the Durban Dash. This was a fun, cheap and no rules way of getting to Cars in the Park in Pietermaritzburg. Sadly Hugh passed away some years ago and the Durban Dash went with him.

We have decided to resurrect this run but in true Hugh fashion the Durban Dash 2019 will not end in Durban but in Scottburgh where we will attend the 2019 Scottburgh Classic Car show.

Another name for this event could be the JD run as the recommended route will faithfully follow the route that the upward DJ run for motorcycles take from Durban to Johannesburg but in reverse, hence JD, from Heidelberg to Hillcrest. If you have ever wondered where and how the DJ run goes now is your chance to follow the same route.

The event will start from Randburg on Friday the 5th July 2019, overnight in Newcastle and spend two nights in Scottburgh leaving Monday the 8th. The recommended route has a distance of 372km on day one to Newcastle and 449km from Newcastle to Scottburgh. Entrants are free to follow any route they wish and also to overnight wherever they wish from camping to an overnight package that we offer as an option for the night in Newcastle and two nights in Scottburgh.

The term vehicle covers any form of motorised road transport from bike to cars to tractors. Arrangements can be made if you wish to join us in an aeroplane of suitable vintage.

The cost of entry is R500.00 which will include a Rally Plate for your vehicle, a printed recommended route schedule, a file of the route to load into a GPS Garmin device if you desire and entry. A percentage of the entry fee will go towards a charity of the Scottburgh Classic Car Show's choice and will also covers the cost of a driven survey of the route recorded on a GPS file. We can offer you accommodation, if available, in Newcastle and Scottburgh but that is your choice. See attached entry forms.

There are no rules and any vehicle can take part however only pre 1975 vehicles are allowed into the Scottburgh Classic Car show arena and later model vehicles have to park in the public parking areas. Whilst there are no rules, as we always do with the events that we organise, we recommend that you take along a fire extinguisher, a tow rope, two high visibility safety vests and 5L of water. Entrants are also encouraged to dress up in period fashion on the show day.

So for a weekend of fun join us for the Durban Dash (which actually goes to Scottburgh) in July 2019.
