The fort was built during the later stages of the 1899-1902 Anglo Boer war as part of a defensive ring around Pretoria which then housed the headquarters of the British forces. No military action ever took place there, and it now forms a well-maintained, tranquil and interesting museum about that bygone era.



As part of the visit organized by Pepi Gaspari, visitors

received copies of a booklet with tales of the events at Delville Wood fourteen years later.

Visitors had a magnificent view Northwards over Groenkloof to the Union Buildings, and Southwards to the Waterkloof Air Base where a giant Antonov was preparing for its flight to Nigeria to repatriate victims of the church collapse. The run ended with a braai on the museum's lawns.
